Kentucky State Treasurer Allison Ball recently announced credit union support of the financial literacy program – which will ensure that educators have access to the resources they need, at no cost – as part of a new bill introduced this year to create a Financial Empowerment Commission.

The idea of financial empowerment is something we believe in deeply. Fort Knox Federal's mission is to improve our members' financial lives and providing more educational programs to students and teachers is the first step toward ensuring that all Kentuckians have the tools to become more financially independent.

Financial Awareness

That's why we recently launched the Fort Knox Federal Vault, an interactive financial literacy program for fourth and fifth grade students at Oran P Lawler Elementary School. The new program empowers students to be smart financial decision makers while they are early in their cognitive development and leverages performance-based games to immerse students in real-life financial

scenarios. The credit union plans to continue rolling out the program at additional elementary schools throughout 2019 and beyond.
